The IARC (International Agency for Research on Cancer) has listed carbon black as "possibly carcinogenic to humans". However, Xerox has concluded that the presence of carbon black in this mixture does not present a health hazard. The IARC classification is based on studies evaluating pure, "free" carbon black. In contrast, toner is a formulation composed of specially prepared polymer and a small amount of carbon black (or other pigment). In the process of making toner, the small amount of carbon black becomes encapsulated within a matrix. Xerox has performed extensive testing of toner, including a chronic bioassay (test for potential carcinogenicity). Exposure to toner did not produce evidence of cancer in exposed animals. The results were submitted to regulatory agencies and published extensively.

The IARC (International Agency for Research on Cancer) has listed titanium dioxide as "possibly carcinogenic to humans". However, Xerox has concluded that the presence of titanium dioxide in this mixture does not present a health hazard. The IARC classification is based on studies in rats using high concentrations of pure, unbound TiO 2 particles of respirable size. Epidemiological studies do not suggest a carcinogenic effect in humans. In addition, the titanium dioxide in this mixture is encapsulated in a matrix or bound to the surface of the toner.
